WRHA Advanced Emergency Nursing



About the Course

In 2004, the WRHA Emergency Task Force acknowledged the need for Emergency Room education at all experience levels. The WRHA Advanced Emergency Nursing Program is an emergency specific education program, developed to address the extensive and unique learning needs of experienced emergency nurses.

The goal of the course is to incorporate the art and science of nursing, enabling participants to become experts and leaders in emergency nursing.

Course Content

The 18-week course is comprised of nine modules which incorporate both the Theoretical and Clinical aspects of emergency nursing. Course content includes:

- Respiratory
- Cardiovascular
- Pediatrics/Reproductive
- Trauma
- Neurology
- Musculoskeletal/Integumentary
- GI/GU/Renal
- Medical Emergencies/ENT
- Mental Health/Professionalism
- Emergency Nursing Pediatric Course
- Advanced Trauma Life Support (Audit)

Clinical

The majority of clinical time will be spent in various regional Emergency Departments. As well, clinical experience in specialized areas will be scheduled to reinforce theoretical content.

Theory

Theoretical content will be in the form of lectures, skills stations, written tests, and formal student presentations. Lectures will be delivered by a variety of specialists.

Cost

Six sponsored positions are available. Sponsorship does not include living or transportation costs. A one-year Return of Service Agreement will be required in return for sponsorship.

Enrollment

Enrollment to the course can be on a full-time or part-time basis.

Entrance Requirements

Applicants must meet the following admission requirements:

1. Graduate from an approved school of nursing or baccalaureate program in nursing.
2. Current active practicing membership of College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba.
3. Minimum of 2821 hours of emergency experience.
4. Completion of WRHA Triage Orientation.
5. Current (certification) in ACLS and TNCC (must remain valid throughout course).

Required Documentation

1. Hours worked: letter or print out from current Human Resources department indicating actual hours worked to date.
2. Official Transcript: submitted directly from the school of nursing/University/College to the application contact. No copies.
3. Letters of Reference: one letter from current manager and one letter from colleague who views participant as a role model (e.g. colleague who participant has preceptored). Both letters to be submitted directly from reference to the application contact.
4. Continuing Education: photocopy proof of current ACLS and TNCC participation.
5. CRNM Registration: photocopy of current active practicing membership with CRNM.
6. Letter of Intent: a one-page double-spaced typed narrative outlining your reasons for applying for the Emergency Nursing Program and your future goals in Emergency Nursing.
